Photographing Everyday Life is a free public exhibition of research participants in mid-to-later in life who created a weekly visual diary exploring the rhythms, patterns and meanings that underlie our habitual and routinised everyday worlds within daily life. The photographic exhibition draws on our research database of visual diaries and represents ordinary and everyday images of ageing and daily life that question and challenge the predominant stereotypical and alternative images of positive and negative images of later life. The exhibition presents photographs in a creative format. A focus on daily routines allows us to research data in novel ways.

To launch the exhibition there will be a special talk by Professor Mary Gilhooly on **Healthy Ageing**; and Dr Wendy Martin and Dr Katy Pilcher will talk about the research. Following the presentations, there will be a launch drinks reception at 5.30pm attended by the Mayor of Hillingdon, Cllr Catherine Dunn.
